

## Superbowl Raffle Rules

A box is drawn with 100 squares; 10 rows and 10 columns.

Each square will be filled with ticket buyer names, drawn randomly.

On the top of the box, each column head will have 0-9 randomly selected.

On the side of the box, each row will have 0-9 randomly selected.

The 2 teams playing in the Superbowl will be randomly assigned to the top or the side of the box. Let's call them Team A (top) and Team B (side).

At the end of each quarter, the number on the far right of each team's score will be used to select a winner. For example, your box is in column 1 - row 3. If team A's score is 11 and Team B's score is 23, you win \$100. Same for 1-13, 21-3, 51-33, etc.

You could win multiple times if score doesn't change. The final quarter is worth \$200 unless there's overtime. In that case, the final overtime score is like a 5<sup>th</sup> quarter worth \$100.
